Dear Mr. President,

Under the provisions of Section 401 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, 42 U.S.C. §§ 5121-5207 (Stafford Act) and 44 C.F.R § 206.36, I respectfully request a major disaster declaration for the Windstorm disaster that occurred on July 24, 2024. I am requesting the counties of Missoula and Powell to be included in this declaration.

Weather Conditions:

On the evening of July 24, 2024, long lasting thunderstorms produced strong damaging winds in west central Montana, particularly in the Missoula County area. This line of long-lasting thunderstorms pushed across north central Idaho in the early evening before moving into western Missoula County around 8:30 p.m. When these thunderstorms settled into to the Missoula area, they produced gusts of winds of 109 mph on Mt. Sentinel, 81 mph at the Missoula Airport and an estimated 90-100 mph winds throughout the city of Missoula. These wind speeds are consistent with the extensive widespread damage across the city and counties.

Summary:

This storm event involved damaging high winds which created widespread damage and debris throughout the City of Missoula, Missoula County and Powell County. Majority of the debris is vegetative, consisting of trees that had limbs ripped off, broken trunks, or were completely uprooted. The wind downed multiple powerlines throughout the counties leaving several thousand people without power for up to eight days. The factors listed above make recovery from this disaster beyond the capabilities of the local emergency fund and the Montana State Disaster fund.

Impacts:

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During the event, the State Emergency Coordination Center was already activated due to critical fire danger throughout the state. This is according to the procedures and protocols outlined in our state emergency plan to assist with response and recovery efforts. I also had Montana Disaster and Emergency Services (DES) staff embedded within the county affected to provide recovery technical assistance. The windstorm knocked down thousands of trees with many of them being mature old growth trees along with extensive damage to powerlines throughout the area. The affected areas are overwhelmed with cleaning up and protecting the public from the widespread debris and powerline damage.

Debris activities and electrical cooperative facilities had the highest-dollar damages for this event, with the full joint damage assessment totaling \$3,773,508.00 in estimated damages. The per capita loss by county ranged from \$4.69 to \$30.79, which is above the FEMA \$4.60 indicator threshold. The recovery resources and staffing capacity these counties have access to are limited. The damages this event incurred to trees and electrical systems are extensive, putting a financial burden on the communities and electrical co-ops. We fully expect this damage estimate to increase as the recovery process moves forward due to unquantified damages incurred to the University of Montana's research facilities and fluctuations in debris estimates as drop off piles continue to grow daily.


